The May 26 Public Meeting of the Board also saw our Board of Trustees passing our Division Budget for the upcoming year. Edmonton Catholic Schools has worked diligently to increase funding to the classroom through improvements in the delivery of administration, operations and maintenance. A total of 78.8% of this budget will support student instruction, while system administration expenses are 2.7%, which is lower than the 3.15% cap established by Alberta Education.

In May, our eyes were turned to mothers and a celebration of Mary. In June, let us turn our eyes to fathers and father figures and to St. Joseph, Jesus' earthly father. In his Apostolic Letter, <u>Patris Corde</u>, our

Holy Father Pope Francis declared this to be the year of St. Joseph. He shares the following: "Fathers are not born but made. A man does not become a father simply by bringing a child into the world, but by taking up the responsibility to care for that child. Whenever a man accepts responsibility for the life of another, in some way he becomes a father to that person." Happy Father's Day to all those who have accepted the sacred responsibility of nurturing our children!
